

# Hannah Storm to Co-Host Traditional Home Magazine's Second Annual Classic Woman Awards in NYC

- Awards Honor Five Women with Extraordinary Commitments to Volunteerism -

**September 25, 2006 (NEW YORK)** – *Traditional Home* Editor-in-Chief Ann Omgig Maine, along with co-host CBS news anchor **Hannah Storm**, will host the magazine's Classic Woman Awards gala in New York City on October 12.
